Oregon State University College of Science Graduation Checklist BioHealth Sciences - Pre-Physical Therapy 2017-18

The pre-physical therapy (PPT) program is designed to fulfill the general requirements for entering a School of Physical Therapy. The following PPT curriculum satisfies the entrance requirements of many accredited schools in the United States. Because the requirements for admission vary, **students** are ultimately responsible for completion of requirements to their choice of schools. Satisfactory completion of coursework does **not** guarantee admission to PT schools since applicants are accepted on a competitive basis. To prepare for PT schools, students must complete a bachelor's degree and all prerequisite courses. In addition, **paid or volunteer work in direct patient care is usually required for admission to most programs.**

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- 1. WR 121and COMM must be completed satisfactorily (C-) within the first 45 hours of OSU work. WR II must be completed satisfactorily within the first 90 hours of OSU work. Transfer students must complete WR II and COMM within the first 45 hours of OSU credits.
- 2. Students should be aware that some physical therapy schools require 9-12 credits of Writing and Literature. WR 327 is recommended. It is the responsibility of the students to educate themselves and fulfill *ALL* prerequisites requested by professional schools.
- 3. Many PT schools require courses in Humanities and/or Social Sciences. The Baccalaureate Core may be used for completion of those requirements.
- 4. A minor in Chemistry is possible with one additional non-organic chemistry class such as CH 324, Quantitative Analysis (4cr.).
- 5. Most PT schools require **observational experience**, usually a minimum of **100 hours**.

- 7. Most PT schools require application to their program through the Physical Therapy Centralized Application Service (PTCAS). Information about the site is at http://www.ptcas.org/. The site provides links to schools across the country.
- 8. Most PT schools require students to take the General Record Exam (GRE) no later than October/November of the academic year in which they apply. Detailed information on dates and locations can be found at http://www.ets.org.
